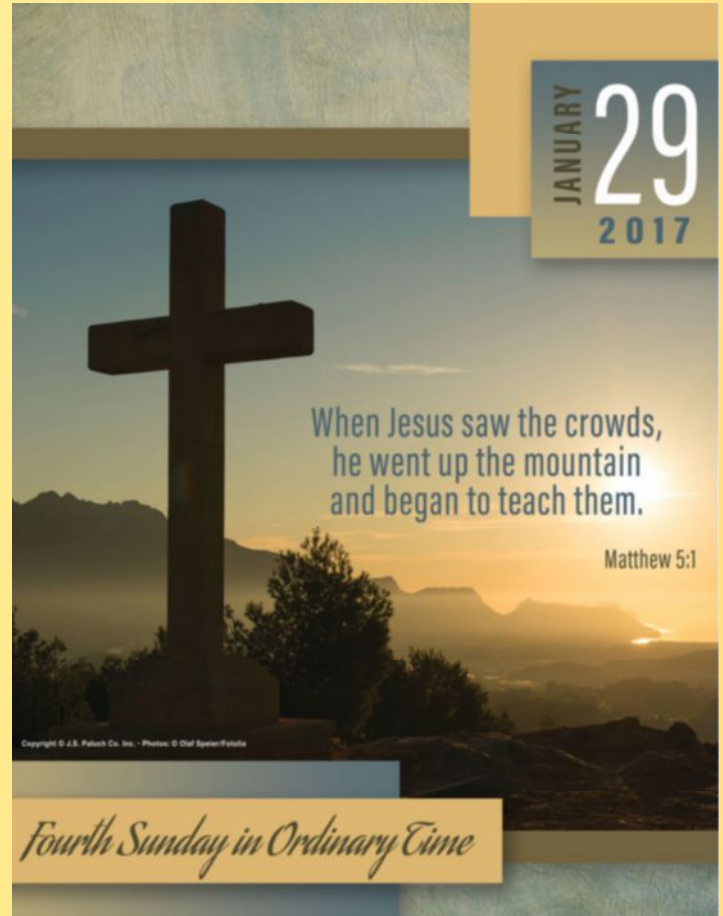

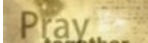

## Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

January 29, 2017

Zeph 2:3; 3:12-13; 1 Cor 1:26-31; Matt 5:1-12a  
Psalm 146

Dear Families:

In today's gospel we read about the BEATITUDES. Jesus left us the beatitudes as a program that we can follow in our Christian life. To be beatified means to be blessed; to be happy. We all want to be happy.

Today, more than ever, we are constantly receiving recipes to find happiness; the funny thing is that we all watch the same T.V. and we are getting the same recipes. Many follow these recipes and the results lead to pain, suffering and destruction. They are false recipes of happiness. Every soap opera or mini series tries to show the path to happiness. This ends at a dead end because it is sought in the wrong way and lacks in moral Christian values. If you are married, you have at your side the person that God has chosen for you; this is where we should build, with the grace of God, the foundation of peace and internal happiness. Sometimes it is thought that happiness can be found in things such as the color of our eyes or in the way we look (there is fantasy to every taste) after time though, we end up hating what seemed so ideal. Be careful with the "recipes" on T.V.! They will only heighten our senses but also make us sick to our stomach. More clearly, they will end up giving us human pain, sadness in our children, hatred, resentment and selfishness. How sad to see characters who think they are benefiting through lies, slander, envy, ambition and resentment. These are lamentable messages to the mental and moral health of human beings.

Sometimes we can find a little happiness but not much. What is built on a lie cannot resist the truth that will appear sooner or later.

In today's gospel, Jesus gives us the recipe to be happy. At first glance, we may not see it because it differs from what we think can make us happy. An example of this is when we think that we can find happiness if we are rich. Jesus tells us: "Blessed are the poor in spirit for theirs is the kingdom of heaven", and this is how we can look at each and every one of the beatitudes. In the long run, if we follow Jesus' "recipes" we can realize that "they are not so bad", for they are not based in false promises, false illusions or lies they are based on what really counts: to be close to God, to do the right thing, to help bring peace and to fight for justice.

To be happy is to live with dignity, not worrying about how much money or things we have. To be happy is having friends who are there in difficult moments to help and console us; to be happy is to have the grace of God to find the peace inside and within those who surround us; to be happy is to be free; to be happy is to have God in our homes and to live the faith within the community.

May God grant you happiness.

## Cuarto Domingo del Tiempo Ordinario

Queridas Familias:

Hoy leemos en el evangelio el sermón de las BIENAVENTURANZAS. Las bienaventuranzas son el programa de vida cristiana que Jesús nos dejó. Ser bienaventurado quiere decir ser dichoso, ser feliz. Y todos deseamos ser felices.

Hoy, más que nunca en la historia, recibimos cada día un montón de recetas para ser felices; y lo curioso es que gracias a que todos vemos la misma televisión estamos recibiendo el mismo recetario. Muchos siguen estas recetas y las consecuencias son sufrimiento, dolor, destrucción. Son falsas recetas de felicidad. Cada telenovela o miniserie tratan de presentar caminos de felicidad, pero todos resultan falsos porque se buscan por caminos prohibidos, reñidos con la moral y la decencia cristianas. Si estás casado o casada, ya tienes a tu lado la compañera o el compañero que Dios te ha dado; ahí debes construir con la gracia de Dios tu camino de paz y felicidad interior. Se piensa que la felicidad está en unos ojos azules o morenos, pelo rubio o moreno, figura delgada o gorda (pues para todos los gustos está la fantasía) y después se acaba odiando aquello que parec'a tan ideal. ¡Cuidado! con las "recetas" de la televisión, que halagan los sentidos pero causan dolor de estómago, o, dicho con claridad, crean dolor humano, tristeza en los hijos, odios, rencores, egoísmos. Hay también telenovelas que muestran a los protagonistas disfrutando con la mentira, la calumnia, la envidia, la ambición y el rencor. ¡Que tristes! y lamentables mensajes para la salud mental y moral del ser humano.

A veces se consigue ser un poco feliz por un tiempo, pero no mucho, pues lo que se construye con la mentira no puede resistir a la verdad que tarde o temprano aparecerá.

Jesús, en el evangelio de hoy, nos da las "recetas" para ser felices. No nos gustan a primera vista, pues no se parecen en nada a lo que la televisión en general y sobre todo las telenovelas recetan para ser felices. Por ejemplo, decimos que la felicidad está en ser ricos y Jesús nos dice: "Felices los pobres de espíritu porque de ellos es el Reino de los Cielos", y así podremos recorrer una a una las bienaventuranzas. Pero a la larga, si seguimos las "recetas" de Jesús nos damos cuenta que "no son tan malas", pues no se basan en falsas promesas, falsas ilusiones o mentiras, sino en lo que realmente vale: estar cerca de Dios, hacer el bien, procurar la paz, luchar por la justicia.

Ser felices es vivir con dignidad, no importando el dinero que se tenga o los bienes que se tengan, o las comodidades que se tengan. Ser feliz es tener amigos que en los momentos difíciles, que siempre llegan en toda vida humana, están cerca para ayudar y consolar; ser feliz es tener la gracia de Dios para encontrar la paz interior y la paz con los que nos rodean; ser feliz es poder ser libres; ser feliz es tener a Dios en nuestras casas y vivir la fe en Dios con mi comunidad.

Que Dios los conceda ser felices.

**Blessing of Throats**



**St. Blaise  
February 3**

Diseases of the throat and laryngologists.

St. Blaise was a physician and bishop of Sebaste, Armenia. He hermit living in a cave on Mount Argeus.

was known for his gift of miraculous healing. He saved the life of a boy who had a fishbone stuck in his throat. This is the origin of the custom of blessing the throats on his feast day.

According to legend, sick animals also came to him for healing, but did not bother him during his prayer time.

When the persecution of Agricolaus, governor of Cappadocia and Lesser Armenia, against the Christians came to Sebaste, their hunters went looking for animals in the Argeus forest for their games and found many animals waiting outside St. Blaise's cave.

There they found St. Blaise in prayer and arrested him. Agricolaus tried unsuccessfully to make him apostatize. In prison, St. Blaise healed some prisoners. Finally he was thrown into a lake. St. Blaise, standing on the surface, invited his persecutors to walk on water and demonstrate the power of their gods. But they drowned. When he returned to land he was tortured and beheaded. C. 316.

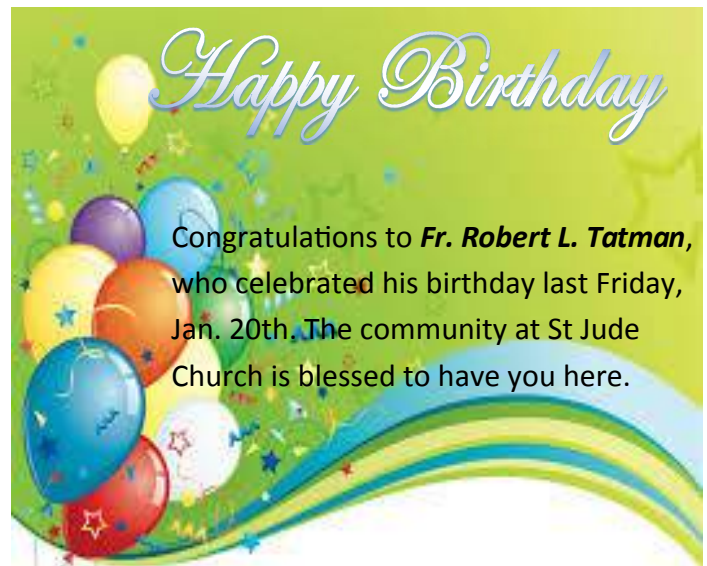
