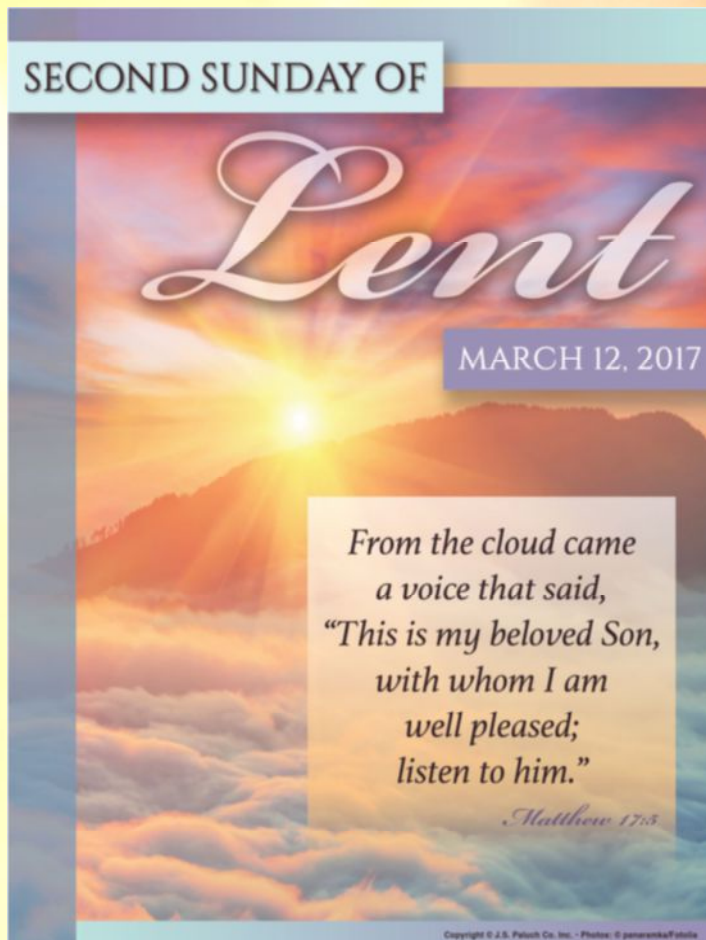

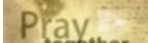

## Second Sunday of Lent

March 12, 2017

Genesis 12:1-4a; 2 Tim 1:8b-10; Matthew 17:1-9  
Psalm 33

Dear Families:

Today's teaching on this Second Sunday of Lent, centered on the Transfiguration of the Lord, tends to produce in us what Jesus tried to show the apostles in this event at Mount Tabor.

Jesus wanted this happening to occur in order to raise the spirits of his first disciples (Peter, James and John), who were depressed after the announcement of the passion. The apostles shared with their Jewish contemporaries the hope of an earthly Messiah, a triumphant warrior, who was to shake off the oppressive yoke of the Roman Empire and establish Judaism worldwide. They could not fathom the idea that the Messiah had to suffer at the hands of the scribes and Pharisees and die a violent death.

Early in his ministry, Jesus silenced the figure of a patient Messiah, clearly announced by the prophet Isaiah, as that would have prevented the accession of the first followers. But when Jesus finally convinced them that he was the true Messiah, immediately after Peter's confession at Caesarea Philippi ("... You are the Messiah, the Son of the living God ..." Mt 16:13-19), he openly announced his future suffering and death to be followed by the resurrection (Matt. 16:21) and declared the vocation of all Christians to take up the cross and follow him (Matt. 16:24).

As we prepare to celebrate the anniversary of the death and resurrection of Christ, as two inseparable aspects of one saving act - the act which saves us. This is seen through the Transfiguration, and is a call to Christian equilibrium.

The advance presentation of the glorious Christ, accompanied by Moses and Elijah, assured the three disciples, Peter, John and James, that the outcome of the Jesus' passion proclamation - "...and on the third day he will rise..." - was indeed true. For the three apostles, destined to closely witness Jesus' agony at Gethsemane, what they were seeing on Tabor was a foretaste of the glory that was to follow Jesus' apparent failure on the cross.

The first part of the message of the Transfiguration (the Glory) is captured by the three apostles, inasmuch as Peter says to Jesus, "It is good that we are here..." (without really knowing what he was saying). Peter was overlooking the second teaching attempted by Jesus in the prodigious event, the fact that Moses and Elijah, who "appeared in glory beside Jesus, were talking to him about his approaching to Jerusalem, where his passion and death would be accomplished.

It is true that the passion was to end in glory, but it is also true that the glory had to be preceded by the passion. As Jesus would tell them later, after his resurrection: "It was necessary that the Christ should suffer before entering into his glory." (Luke 24:46). Paul and Barnabas, after their first apostolic journey, summarized their preaching, by saying: "It is necessary for us to undergo many hardships to enter the kingdom of God." (Acts 14:22).

May we learn the double lesson of Mount Tabor: to embrace both aspects of Christ's Passion and glory; to temporarily embrace the cross, while reveling in the certain hope of eternal happiness.

The Eucharist (Mass) is the synthesis of the death and resurrection of Christ. He who makes himself present on the altar is not the corpse buried on Good Friday, but rather, the risen Christ who "...dies no more; death no longer has dominion over him..." (Rom 6:9).

## Segundo Domingo de Cuaresma

12 de Marzo del 2017

Genesis 12:1-4a; 2 Tim 1:8b-10; Mateo 17:1-9  
Salmo 33 [32]

Queridas Familias:

La enseñanza de este domingo Segundo de Cuaresma, centrada en la Transfiguración del Señor, tiende a producir en nosotros lo que Jesús intentó proporcionar a los apóstoles con el acontecimiento del monte Tabor.

Quiso Jesús que ocurriera este suceso para levantar el ánimo de los primeros discípulos (Pedro, Santiago y Juan), decaídos tras el anuncio de la pasión. Los apóstoles compartían con sus contemporáneos judíos la esperanza de un Mesías terreno, guerrero y triunfador, que habría de sacudir el yugo opresor del Imperio Romano y establecer el judaísmo en el mundo entero. No les cabía en la cabeza que el Mesías hubiera de sufrir a mano de los escribas y fariseos y morir de muerte violenta.

Al principio de su ministerio Jesús silenció la figura de un Mesías paciente, claramente anunciada por el profeta Isaías, pero que habría impedido la adhesión de los primeros seguidores. Pero, cuando ya los tuvo convencidos de que él era el verdadero Mesías, inmediatamente, tras la confesión de Pedro en Cesarea de Filipo (É Tu eres el Mesías, el Hijo de Dios vivo É Mt 16:13-19), les anunció abiertamente su futura pasión y muerte a las que seguiría la resurrección (Mt 16:21) y declaró la vocación de todos los cristianos a llevar con él la cruz (Mt 16:24).

Cuando nos disponemos a celebrar el aniversario de la muerte y resurrección de Cristo, como dos caras inseparables de un mismo acto salvador, cuya participación en la de ambas caras nos hará salvos, viene muy bien el recuerdo de la Transfiguración, que es una llamada al equilibrio cristiano.

La presentación anticipada de Cristo glorioso, acompañado de Moisés y Elías, aseguraba a los tres discípulos, Pedro, Juan y Santiago, que era cierto el final del anuncio de la pasión que Jesús terminaba proclamando: "Y resucitaré al tercer día". Para los tres apóstoles que más de cerca iban a ser testigos de su agonía en Gethsemane, lo que estaban viendo en el Tabor era un anticipo de la gloria que habría de seguir al aparente fracaso de la cruz.

La primera parte del mensaje de la Transfiguración (la Gloria) es captada por los tres apóstoles, tanto que Pedro dice a Jesús: "Bueno es estar aquí" (sin saber lo que decía). Pedro pasaba por alto la segunda enseñanza intentada por Jesús en el hecho prodigioso. Y es que Moisés y Elías que aparecían en gloria al lado de Jesús hablaban con él de su partida que iba a cumplir en Jerusalén, es decir de su pasión y muerte.

Cierto que la pasión habría de terminar en gloria; pero ésta tenía que ser precedida por la pasión. Como les diría Jesús después de resucitado: "Era necesario que el Cristo padeciera así entrara en su gloria" (Lc 24:46). Pablo y Bernabé, a la vuelta de su primer viaje apostólico, resumían su predicación diciendo: "Es necesario que pasemos muchas tribulaciones para entrar en el reino de los cielos" (Hechos 14:22).

Aprendamos la doble lección del monte Tabor: besar la medalla Pasión y gloria por ambas caras; abrazarse temporalmente con la cruz y vivir con la esperanza cierta de la felicidad eterna.

La Eucaristía (la Misa) es la síntesis de la muerte y resurrección de Cristo. El que se hace presente en el altar no es el cadáver enterrado el Viernes Santo, sino Cristo resucitado que ya no muere más; la muerte ya no tiene dominio sobre él (Rm 6:9).

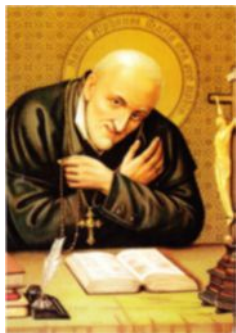

**St. Patrick's Day Dispensation** - With St. Patrick's Day falling on a Friday (March 17) during the Lenten Season, Bishop Frank J. Dewane is granting a one-day dispensation of abstaining from meat on that Friday alone. The faithful are encouraged to choose another day in the same week to abstain from meat and to perform some other penance or work of charity on March 17 to assist in their spiritual Lenten journey. Abstinence from meat is to be observed by all Catholics who are 14 years of age and older. Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent (and Good Friday) are days of abstinence. Fasting, almsgiving and prayer are the three traditional disciplines of Lent.

**Diocese-wide Opportunity for Sacrament of Reconciliation** - This Lent the Diocese of Venice will have the Sacrament of Reconciliation available at the same time at ALL Parishes to allow the faithful ample opportunity to receive God's Mercy. To make this opportunity as convenient as possible, in consultation with the Diocesan Presbyteral Council, the Bishop has designated the following days and times for Confession at EACH Parish: Friday, April 7, from 4:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.; and Saturday, April 8, from 9:00 a.m. to noon. The precept of confessing grave sins and receiving Holy Communion at least once during the Lenten Season merits a reminder to the faithful to take advantage of this opportunity.

Out of respect for the Eucharist, the celebrant priest and for the congregation, please **DO NOT** leave the Church right after Communion, but stay until the final Blessing. *Thank you!!*
